

## Shiro, a polyhedric modular system

Shiro is a versatile modular system realized in wood and marble, and thanks to its shape and possible interpretations it is particularly suitable for contract use. Its concept is based on the combination of wood and marble, a static gravity game that allows to each module to be installed only with two plugs; and it can be a bookcase or furniture with no doors. It can be also a functional storage for objects and linen.

The harmonic variation of horizontal and vertical plans is able to interpret various living and professional exigencies: and this is the soul of Shiro. When it is a bookcase, it can also be against the wall or also bifacial. In this last case, apart from allow its use from both sides; it can also become a nice partition and then the protagonist of the space.

Shiro is proposed in various marbles and in brushed larch, which can be natural, earth color, bleached or aged.

marbles: Bianco Calacatta, Bianco Estremoz, Bianco Sivec, Grey Saint Marie, Onyx, Ebanò

wood: brushed larch that can be natural, earth color, bleached or aged

**Sizes**

Modules 120 cm X 35 cm X h 41 cm - at least two modules

Self supporting bookcase: modules 120cm X 67 cm X h 41 cm - at least two modules
